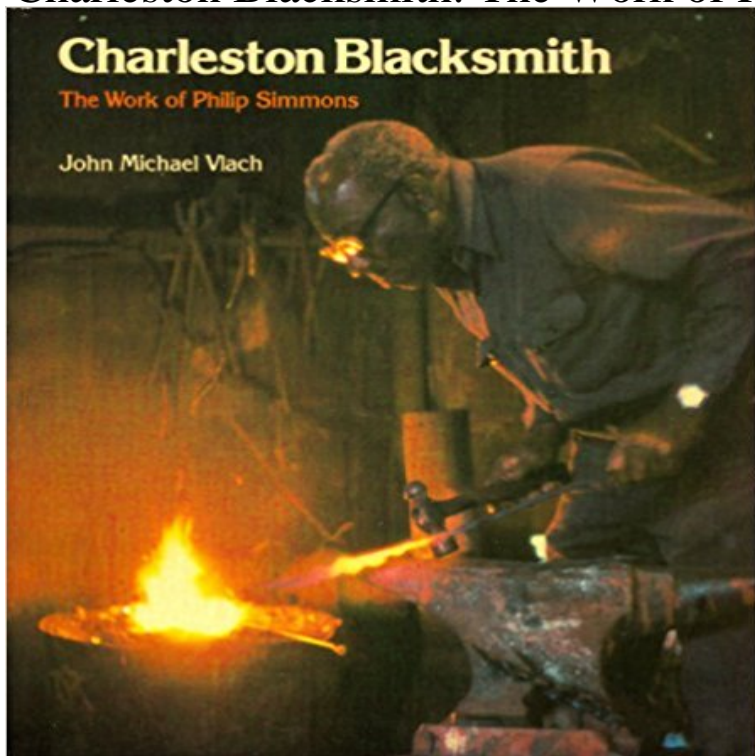


Charleston Blacksmith: The Work of Philip Simmons
